- The City of Columbus Division of Refuse Collection will host drive-thru drop-off sites after Halloween for residents to sustainably dispose of pumpkins and gourds. Carved jack-olanterns with candles removed, full and moldy pumpkins, and gourds are acceptable to drop off for composting. Pumpkins decorated with paint or permanent marker cannot be accepted. The pumpkin drop-off sites will operate on three Saturdays — Nov. 4, Nov. 25, and Dec. 2 — from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Columbus Refuse Collection transfer station at 4260 Morse Rd.
- Residents can take their election signs to the Bill McDonald Athletic Complex, 4990 Olentangy River Rd, from 8 a.m. to noon on November 11. All paper, plastic and coroplast signs (including metal stands) will be accepted and recycled.

This study is to improve traffic flow between the Columbus and Toledo regions. These concepts aim to provide safer and more efficient travel, including increased travel time reliability for through traffic.
